## **1 How to use this guide**

This guide provides information on development issues and the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). It was especially designed for journalists and media agents. However, everyone interested in MDGs may find it a useful piece of advice. It consists of two major parts. The first part of the guide you will find a brief introduction on the MDGs and basic principles for their promotion. The second part will include detailed contact information on information points in your country, Europe and the developing countries as well. In addition you will find a list of links, related to the MDGs.

## **2 Development cooperation and education**

Development cooperation takes places in the countries of the south. It aims at economic growth, fighting poverty, hunger and diseases, implementation of good governance structures, the promotion of equality, human rights and democracy. It contributes to the protection of the natural resources by furthering a sustainable development of the countries of the global south.

The achievement of these aims is possible only, if developing countries and donor countries in the North work together conjointly. Development in this sense also implies the establishment of a global partnership for development. Donors in the North as well as the developing countries bear responsibilities in this process. The amount of development aid on the gross investment in developing countries like for instance India and Thailand is below 20%. In sub Sahara Africa it does not exceed 20%. These numbers illustrate, that the major part of efforts is contributed by developing countries themselves. Thus, development cooperation is always more than aid. It means help to finally initiate self helping forces by the developing country.

To support the developing countries on their path, a growing community of people in North are contributing by numerous activities. Development education aims on changing the attitude of people in the North. It seeks to influence the interests of policy makers and decision takers, change the behaviour of consumers and unjust rules of world trade. Other activities of supporters in the north comprise lobbying, advocacy and campaigning in order to either raise direct supporting actions for the global south or to put pressure on politicians.

Media plays a vital part in this process. It has the means to inform the public about current matters of development. On the other hand, media can articulate public opinion on development issues by accompanying campaigns for development and reporting about various activities of civil society groups. Thus, media are important for communication between development activists and politicians in the North. Additionally they provide information channels on development activities between actors in the north and the south.

### 3 The Millennium development goals

The Millennium Development Goals base on a political process, which reaches back as far as the early 1990's. Starting with the "World Conference on Education for All" in Jomtien- Thailand 1990, many conferences dealt with the global challenge of poverty and the implementation of civil, social, political and cultural rights.

In September 2000, the United Nations General assembly gathered for the 55th time. 189 head of states participated. This meeting is called the „Millennium Summit“. The agenda was to take position of points for a just world in the 21st century. As a result of this summit the Millennium declaration was announced. All member states committed to general but binding aims for poverty reduction and a sustainable development worldwide and within their own states.

In order to put the announcements into practice a working group was built in the aftermath of this Millennium Summit which consisted of members of the UN Secretary, the World Bank, the OECD and the International Monetary Fund. The working group set up 8 overarching goals (Millennium Development Goals) to be achieved by the year 2015. Each goal consists of several targets, dividing the overall goal into more detailed steps. The eight MDGs consist of 21 targets in total. The goals in detail:

#### 3.1 Goal 1: Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger



##### Background

- 1 out of 6 people is suffering hunger
- extremely poor is, who has not more than 1 \$ a day to make a living
- poverty means living without chances
- 1 out of 5 people lives in

##### Targets

- Target 1.A: Halve, between 1990 and 2015, the proportion of people whose income is less than one dollar a day.
- Target 1.B: Achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all, including women and young people
- Target 1.C: Halve, between 1990 and 2015, the proportion of people who suffer from hunger

### 3.2 Goal 2: Achieve universal primary education



#### Background

- 73 million children are not receiving basic education
- 38 Million off these are living in Sub Saharan Africa
- every sixth pupil gets enrolled to late

#### Target

- Target 2 A: Ensure that, by 2015, children everywhere, boys and girls alike, will be able to complete a full course of primary schooling.

### 3.3 Goal 3: Promote gender equality and empower women



#### Background

- 7 out of 10 people living in extreme poverty are women
- 80% of all refugees are women
- Two thirds of all illiterates are women
- Women carry out 70% of all unpaid work, earn 10% of worldwide income and share 1% of world's wealth
- Only 17% of parliamentarians worldwide are women
- Women occupy only 14% of leaders positions in economy and government

#### Target

- Target 3.A: Eliminate gender disparity in primary and secondary education, preferably by 2005, and in all levels of education no later than 2015

### 3.4 Goal 4: Reduce Child Mortality



#### Background

- In 2006, 9,7 million children under 5 years died because of extreme poverty - every 3 seconds 1 child
- 37% of these children die within the first 5 month
- Pneumonia is the killer number 1 for children under 5 years
- Africa accounts for 50% of all maternal deaths and 50% of child deaths

#### Target

- Target 4.A: Reduce by two thirds, between 1990 and 2015, the under-five mortality rate

### 3.5 Goal 5: Improve Maternal Health



#### Background

- The main reasons for maternal deaths are haemorrhage, infection and unsafe abortion
- Every minute, at least one woman dies from complications related to pregnancy or childbirth- 529 000 women a year
- 1 out of 22 births in developing countries leads to the death of the mother- in developed countries its 1 out of 7.300 births
- 10 million women each year suffer birth related injury, infection or disease

#### Targets

- Target 5A: Reduce by three quarters the maternal mortality ratio
- Target 5B: Achieve universal access to reproductive health

### 3.6 Goal 6: Combat HIV/AIDS, Malaria and other Diseases



#### Background

- Over 33 million people are infected by HIV/ AIDS
- More than 1 billion people have no access to clean drinking water
- 350- 500 million people are infected by malaria each year
- 1 Million die each year because of malaria

#### Targets

- Target 6A: Have halted by 2015 and begun to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDS
- Target 6B: Achieve, by 2010, universal access to treatment for HIV/AIDS for all those who need it
- Target 6C: Halt and begin to reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases

### 3.7 Goal 7: Ensure environmental sustainability



#### Background

- 90% of the global energy derives from fossil recourses
- Every 15 minutes one species is dying off
- Within 100 years water consumption rose by the factor 10
- Within the last 20 years, 200 million ha of forest were destroyed, an area as big as Western Europe
- 70% of fishing grounds are close to over fishing or already over fished



- Global warming leads to more natural disasters
- Ocean levels are rising twice as fast as 20 before
- Within 20 years, one million square kilometres farmland were lost to erosion

### Targets

- Target 7A: Integrate the principles of sustainable development into country policies and programmes; reverse loss of environmental resources
- Target 7B: Reduce biodiversity loss, achieving, by 2010, a significant reduction in the rate of loss
- Target 7C: Reduce by half the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water
- Target 7D: Achieve significant improvement in lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers, by 2020

## 3.8 Goal 8: Develop a global partnership for development



### Background

- Official development aid dropped since 2005
- External debt of developing countries almost halved between 2000 and 2007
- In developing country 11% of population uses the internet, in developed countries its 58%

### Targets

- Target 8A: Develop further an open, rule-based, predictable, non-discriminatory trading and financial system
- Includes a commitment to good governance, development and poverty reduction – both nationally and internationally
- Target 8B: Address the special needs of the least developed countries
- Includes: tariff and quota free access for the least developed countries' exports; enhanced programme of debt relief for heavily indebted poor countries (HIPC) and cancellation of official bilateral debt; and more generous ODA for countries committed to poverty reduction
- Target 8C: Address the special needs of landlocked developing countries and small island developing States (through the Programme of Action for the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States and the outcome of the twenty-second special session of the General Assembly)
- Target 8D: Deal comprehensively with the debt problems of developing countries through national and international measures in order to make debt sustainable in the long term
- Target 8E: In cooperation with pharmaceutical companies, provide access to affordable essential drugs in developing countries
- Target 8F: In cooperation with the private sector, make available the benefits of new technologies, especially information and communications

For each target there are indicators. These indicators visualize the progress on the target. The reference numbers on which to compare the results is the year 1990. A short example for this mechanism: Goal 5 wants to “Improve maternal health”. A specific target to achieve this goal is to reduce the maternal mortality ratio by three quarters between 1990 and 2015. An indicator for a progression would be for example the proportion of births attended by skilled health personnel.

Thus, the Millennium goals are not just announcements. They can be quantified and checked in numbers against reality.

The 56th general assembly of the United Nations agreed upon these eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) on in 2001.

## **4 Principles for the promotion of MDGs**

### **4.1 Challenge**

Media coverage tries to capture and interpret reality. When broadcasting on development issues, the choice of messages and images can be difficult. Images of extreme poverty and humanitarian distress are for real. They are negative and cannot be ignored. People living in developing countries face many burdens. Media can give these hardships a voice and make public the privation of those without a public voice. However, the line between showing poor living conditions in order to reach public awareness and humiliating those in need is thin.

### **4.2 Checklist<sup>1</sup>**

Many organizations working in the field of development and MDGs have obliged to certain sets of rules, which define behavioural standards. These codes of conducts are designed to give assistance to practitioners. When broadcasting on development issues these basic recommendations may prove helpful in order to balance journalism between information and privacy of those portrayed.

#### **4.2.1 General principles**

- Equality of all people
- Insurance of the dignity of the people portrayed
- Promotion of fairness, solidarity and justice

#### **4.2.2 Choice of development images and messages**

- Choice of messages and images should be based on respect, equality, solidarity and justice.
- Images and messages should not divide 'us and them' but instead, foster a sense of inter-connected common humanity.
- Truthful representation of any image or depicted situation both in its immediate and in its wider context so as to improve public understanding of the complex realities of development.
- Exclusion of messages and images potentially stereotyping or discriminating. This may apply on situations and locations as well as on people involved.
- Respect for the highest standards in relation to human rights and protection of the vulnerable people.

#### 4.2.3 Participation

- Recordkeeping of the subjects consent to be named or identifiable.
- Use of images, messages as well as individualised studies with the full understanding, participation and permission of the people concerned or their legal guardian.
- Opening possibilities for the portrayed people to tell their stories by themselves.

#### 4.2.4 Working with information on development and MDGs

- Where possible documentation of the portrayed story.
- Explaining the use of photos to the portrayed in TV, newspaper and other media channels
- If the portrayed person has no access, giving examples to open access to the media of image publication
- Accurate and representative story capturing.

#### Children and vulnerable groups

- Covering minors only according to the Convention on the Rights of the Child
- Building pressure free interview spaces for children to express their opinion and ideas freely
- Avoiding transmission of vulnerability where it does not exist

#### 4.2.5 Consent

##### Not needed

- Individuals in public which are not recognisable
- Crowds in public (e.g. MDG demonstrations)
- Public figures in public context (e.g. MDG campaigning information)

##### Verbal consent

- Wherever possible
- Parents, guardians
- Teachers of children
- Staff of service programmes

##### Written consent

- In all circumstances, where private information is spread by story or image

##### Examples:

- Sexual orientation
- Health and behaviour  
e.g. HIV-positive persons, abortion, alcohol and drug use

➤ Victims

e.g. slave workers, domestic and gender violence, rape or abuse
